REFLECT

We love our technology don't we? We love it when we have powerful Wi-Fi, when our dishwashers and appliances work well, and when our cars start right up. We're used to it and we've come to expect it. But how much more powerful are the promises we have in the Lord? Promises of provision, protection, peace, and most of all His presence.. Eventually your technology will fail you and leave you disconnected...but the Lord will never leave you nor forsake you. In Psalms 27 we learn from King David of his ABSOLUTE faith in the Lord to lead him, deliver him, and do good for him all the days of his life. Let's dive into Psalms 27 and receive all that the Lord has for His kids as we look to Him!

REALIZE

1. God wants you to make it personal

- **Scripture Reference;** Psalms 27; Psalms 23:1; John 21:19; 1 Samuel 13:14; 2 Chronicles 16:9b
- **Questions for Reflection**
 - What difficult times have you lived through in your own life and have experienced God's care and guidance for you personally? Read 2 Cor 1:3-4

2. Two connections will never falter: Prayer and God's Word

- **Scripture Reference;** Psalms 27; Luke 11:1; Isaiah 55:11
- **Questions for Reflection**
 - How does believing that the best is yet to come help you stay grounded and focused in challenging times?

3. Courage and Hope are a byproduct of waiting on the Lord

- **Scripture Reference;** Psalms 27; Acts 4:13; Hebrews 4:16; Romans 8:28-29; Phillipians 1:6
- **Questions for Reflection**
 - What does it mean for you to wait on the Lord?

Optional Follow-up Questions:

- What makes you say that?
- How do you feel about that?
- How would you explain your answer to a non-Christian friend or neighbor?
- Why did God design it to work that way? Why not just do (whatever else) instead?
- What would you say to someone who disagrees with that?
- Why do we really have to do it like that? Why can't we just go (some other route) instead?
