REFLECT

There are sooooooo many things to adjust to and learn as we begin our new life in Christ. This series is about "ESSENTIALS"...that which is absolutely necessary; extremely important... Nothing ...ABSOLUTELY NOTHING is more essential than what the Amplified Bible calls your "vital union" with Christ. John uses the metaphor of a vine and branches to give us a picture that communicates what our relationship with Christ looks like. There are ESSENTIAL truths to be drawn out from the vine and branch metaphor that will help us live a more fruitful life in Christ.

REALIZE

1. Jesus is the TRUE vine.

2. Jesus will lead us into seasons (repeatedly) of PRUNING.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:2-3
- Questions for Reflection
 - Do I view my relationship to Jesus as the source of fruitfulness in my life?

3. Without JESUS there is no fruitfulness in our lives.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:4
- Questions for Reflection
 - Do I view my relationship to Jesus as the source of fruitfulness in my life?

4. Know Your Position and Role.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:5
- Questions for Reflection
 - What does union with Christ look like practically in my life throughout the day?

5. Our lives WITHER and DIE apart from God.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:6
- Questions for Reflection
 - What does union with Christ look like practically in my life throughout the day?

6. IF (conditional) I DWELL IN CHRIST and HE in me I will bear much fruit.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:7
- Questions for Reflection
 - What prevents me from being more dependent/trusting of Jesus for my life?

7. Our fruitfulness HONORS God and authenticates our relationship.

- Scripture Reference; John 15:1-8
- Questions for Reflection
 - What prevents me from being more dependent/trusting of Jesus for my life?

Optional Follow-up Questions:

- What makes you say that?
- How do you feel about that?
- How would you explain your answer to a non-Christian friend or neighbor?
- Why did God design it to work that way? Why not just do (whatever else) instead?
- What would you say to someone who disagrees with that?
- Why do we really have to do it like that? Why can't we just go (some other route) instead?
